

Wilson Area School District Path to Reopening: Health and Safety Plan

Wilson Area School District's Health and Safety Plan outlines our school district's instructional and non- instructional school reopening activities for the 2020-2021 school year. The plan was unanimously (9-0) approved by the Board of Education on Thursday, August 20, 2020. As with all emergency plans, the Health and Safety Plan developed for our District was tailored to the unique needs of each school and created in consultation with local health agencies. All school activities are informed by [Governor Wolf's Process to Open Pennsylvania](#).

The Governor's plan has categorized reopening into three broad phases: substantial, moderate, and low risk. These designations signal how counties and/or regions may begin easing some restrictions on school, work, congregate settings, and physical interactions. Depending upon the public health conditions in our county, there could be additional actions, orders, or guidance provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) and/or the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH) designating our county as being in the substantial, moderate, low risk phase. There may be times that our county may not experience a straight path from a substantial designation, to a moderate, and then a low risk designation. Instead, cycling back and forth between less restrictive to more restrictive designations may occur as public health indicators improve or worsen in our local area. Wilson Area School District's Health and Safety Plan accounts for changing conditions to ensure fluid transition from more to less restrictive conditions in each of the phase requirements as needed.

- Scaffolded reopening: Some students are engaged in in-person learning, while others are distance learning (i.e., some grade levels in-person, other grade levels remote learning).

Roles and Responsibilities for Health and Safety Preparedness and Response Planning

- Prevent accidents, injuries and work/school-related illnesses in the schools
- Create and implement health and safety policies in accordance with the latest legislation and to ensure that these policies are implemented by staff
- Create and implement health and safety procedures/protocols/practices in accordance with the latest guidance and recommendations for the Department of Health (DOH) and Center for Disease Control (CDC) and to ensure that these procedures/protocols/practices are implemented by staff
- Create a Health and Safety Plan and ensure it's updated regularly to reflect any changes to the law and/or guidance from federal, state, and local health officials.
- Ensure that each member of staff is aware of and adheres to the Health and Safety Plan
- Provide regular inspections and risk assessments, and ensure that any hazards or defects are rectified immediately
- Maintain records and thoroughly investigate any accident, community spread illness, and recommend any improvements in health and safety standards if required
- Provide training to all staff in health and safety issues, and advising them on protective clothing and equipment where necessary
- Serve as the key points of contact for any member of staff who has a query or concern regarding the health and safety of the workplace
- Work closely with management, as well as health and safety inspectors

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<p>The Wilson Area School District is committed to provide a safe and clean environment for all students and staff. ACT 13 requires school entities to establish procedures for custodial staff to follow when cleaning and disinfecting that are based on CDC recommendations. WASD's detailed cleaning plan has been developed in accordance with the CDC recommended guidelines. All high touch surfaces will be disinfected regularly following the plan. This includes door handles, light switches, handrails, and student desks and chairs. Cleaning supplies such as disinfectant spray for each classroom and a fogger machine have been purchased in addition to our regular custodial cleaning supplies. All cleaning supplies are reviewed in accordance with CDC guidance. Ventilation systems will be checked regularly to ensure they operate properly. Outdoor air circulation will be increased by opening windows and doors when possible. Use of water fountains will be prohibited, and the use of water bottles will be permitted in the classroom setting. In the event there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 within our facilities, a team of trained custodians will be assigned for the cleaning and disinfection of that area as outlined in the detailed cleaning plan and procedures. All maintenance and custodial staff have been trained in the detailed cleaning plan and procedures, as well as the use of the personal protective equipment that will be needed during this process.</p>

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<p>The Wilson Area School District has modified our transportation plans in order to prioritize the health and safety of students and staff being transported. Bus runs have been adjusted to limit the number of students on the school bus to be no more than two per seat to the extent possible. Multiple runs will be provided for the same route to ensure physical distancing guidelines. All students will have assigned seats. Students will be seated strategically to coordinate pick up/drop off locations to minimize unnecessary contact with other students. Students' assigned seats will be filled individually from back to front as students are picked up from their stops. Students will be expected to wear masks while being transported on the bus when age and individualized needs are appropriate. Bus drivers will provide masks for students who forgot their mask. Building specific procedures will be in place for the staging of students arriving to school early on busses to maintain physical distancing requirements. Buses will be cleaned and disinfected daily. Bus windows will be opened when feasible to allow for increased ventilation.</p>

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The Wilson Area School District plan's priority is to allow for physical distancing and limit the number of individuals in one area to help mitigate the spread of illness to the maximum extent possible. To assist with limiting the number of individuals coming into contact, the District will create self contained classrooms K-8 where students will remain in the same group throughout their day, including lunch and special times. All schools will have directional tape in the hallways to maintain a safe distance apart from one another and students will be encouraged to wear a mask, unless required, in the hallway. Students will be encouraged to sanitize upon entry and exit of the classroom. Staggered building entrance and dismissal schedules and procedures will

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limit the number of students entering at one time. Staff and parents will be trained on the use of the daily symptom monitoring tool prior to coming to school. All students and staff will be trained and reinforced daily on physical distancing procedures and protocols via videos, daily announcements, and signage throughout the school. All students, parents, and staff will be trained about COVID19 mitigation of the spread, and the teaching of appropriate hygiene and washing techniques. All staff will be trained on the implementation of the Health and Safety Plan prior to providing services to students.

Health room procedures have been developed to reduce overcrowding of the health room and to isolate presumed positive students until a parent is able to pick them up. If a physician orders COVID19 testing for any student or staff member, they will not be permitted to return to school until the test results are received. Positive staff and students will be allowed to return to school following the CDC guidelines of at least 10 days from first symptom and at least 24 hours symptom free. Presumed positive students will be tracked by building principals, school nurses, and the pandemic coordinator. Presumed positive cases will be continuously followed up on. Students who are uncomfortable with being in school will be given the option to participate in online instruction at any time. Administrators and school nurses will receive specialized training from Johns Hopkins in COVID19 and contact tracing. We will consult our local Department of Health in making recommendations and final decisions on any presumed positive cases within our schools.
